SECTION 1: SCOPE OF WORKS AND TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

1. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO PARTICIPANTS

1.1 Participants shall provide full and accurate answers to the questions posed in this document, and, where required explicitly state "Comply/Not Comply" regarding compliance with the requirements. Participants **must** substantiate their response to all questions, including full details on how their proposal/solution will address specific functional/ technical requirements. All documents as indicated must be supplied as part of the bid response.

2. PROJECT BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVE

The Localisation Support Fund (LSF) is a non-profit company and public benefit organisation aimed at driving industrial development and economic transformation in South Africa. Our mandate includes identifying and supporting industries where South Africa has a unique competitive advantage, fostering increased industrial output, driving job creation, and facilitating partnerships between stakeholders across the value chain. The LSF seeks to leverage insights, innovation, and targeted interventions to maximise impact and enable sustainable industrialisation in South Africa.

2.1 Background

Hemp, a versatile and sustainable crop, offers opportunities across diverse sectors, including textiles, bioplastics, construction materials, and wellness products. Increasingly, the industrial opportunities are being considered and clustered within the "5F" framework: farming, food, feeds, fibres, and fractions.

Hemp also presents a significant opportunity for climate change mitigation and industrial transition in South Africa, particularly within the Just Energy Transition (JET) framework. Recognized by the JET team as one of five alternative sectors to coal, hemp's potential lies in its ability to sequester carbon, rehabilitate degraded land, and create sustainable employment in regions historically dependent on fossil fuel industries. Moreover, integrating hemp into the JET framework could facilitate access to global green financing, leveraging mechanisms such as carbon credits, blended finance, and international sustainability funds. This transition is particularly relevant in Mpumalanga, where rehabilitating mine land with industrial hemp could create thousands of jobs while aligning with global decarbonization efforts.

South Africa's favourable climatic conditions and interest in industrialising hemp provide a foundation for creating jobs, enhancing local manufacturing, and driving exports of value-added products. However, the sector remains nascent, with limited local value chain integration and data to guide investments and regulatory support.

During the State of the Nation Address, delivered on 6 February 2025, His Excellency, President Ramaphosa, stated: "We want South Africa to be leading in the commercial production of hemp and cannabis."

To address this gap, working in consultation with the Presidency of the Republic of South Africa, the LSF intends to commission a phased study ("**Hemp Industrialisation Study**"), focusing on:

- Identifying the 2-3 most promising industrial hemp value chains.
- Conducting unit economic analyses for these pathways.

- Developing recommendations on prioritisation, financing, and regional development strategies to support the growth of these industrial opportunity in South Africa.

In developing the Hemp Industrialisation Study, the LSF is seeking a partner, which whom we can co-create the scope. The RFI thus seeks to gather insights and credentials from interested parties. The insights gathered through this RFI will guide any formal Request for Quotation (RFQ) process for selecting a service provider to execute the Hemp Industrialisation Study which may be commissioned.

2.2 **Objective of the RFI**

The LSF seeks to engage with market participants, subject matter experts, and potential service providers to inform the development of a Hemp Industrialisation Study that can enhance the quality of decision-making around the industrialisation of hemp in South Africa.

This RFI is a first step in this process, which will be used to gather insights on structuring a comprehensive study to identify high-potential industrial hemp value chains, assess their economic viability, and develop actionable strategies for early-stage industrialisation. Once actionable insights have been gathered through the RFI process, a second step in the development of the study will follow, which will include an RFQ.

The RFI may also be used to establish a short-list of potential partners who may selected to bid for the Hemp Industrialisation Study through the RFQ process.

Drawing on both local and international experience, the main objectives of any future Hemp Industrialisation Study are as follows:

- **Detailed Financial Analysis of Hemp Pathways:**

Conduct a quantitative financial analysis across various industrial hemp pathways, focusing on metrics such as upfront capital needs, operating margins, payback periods, and potential returns on investment (ROI). The financial analysis should also include mapping of available technologies at the global frontier focusing on their applicability and competitiveness to define end use applications.

- **Guidance for Business Case Development:**

Provide strategic insights on structuring viable business cases for selected industrial pathways, addressing necessary public and private sector support.

- **Social Partnership Opportunities:**

Identify opportunities for social partnerships (between government, business, labour, and community) to mobilize capital, support capacity-building, and facilitate technological adoption within the hemp industry.

- **Inclusion Models for Traditional and Smallholder Farmers:**

Evaluate financially viable models for integrating traditional and smallholder farmers into the hemp supply chain, ensuring inclusive participation.

- **Policy and Regulatory Recommendations:**

Offer data-backed policy guidance to support industrial pathways with high potential, recommending short-, medium-, and long-term priorities for policy alignment and value chain development.

3. TERMS OF REFERENCE

Respondents are invited to provide input in the form of a 10 – 15-page written document or presentation, on the following aspects to shape the study and to understand potential service-provider capability effectively:

3.1 Methodology and Scope:

- Provide a summary of your understanding of the industrial hemp value chain and its status, both globally and in South Africa.
- How would you conduct market assessments to identify the 2-3 industrial hemp value chains in South Africa where the country can be most competitive?
- Should the Hemp Industrialisation Study be restricted to the industrial applications of hemp, alone, or should it include industrial applications of cannabis as well?
- How would you conduct the unit economic analysis of hemp value chains?

3.2 Inclusion and Impact:

- How would you consider the potential integration of traditional and smallholder farmers into emerging industrial hemp value chains?

3.3 Technology and Innovation:

- How should the technological complexity of various industrial pathways be considered to identify competitive industrial hemp value chains in South Africa?
- Are there any potential technological congruencies across different industrial pathways that should be considered in the development of the industrial strategy?

4. EVALUATION CRITERIA

4.1 Evaluation Framework

To ensure a structured approach to assessing responses, the LSF will evaluate submissions based on the following criteria:

- **Relevance:** Alignment with the RFI objectives and the proposed study framework.
- **Depth of Insight:** Quality and depth of analysis, including innovative approaches and case studies.
- **Feasibility:** Practicality and applicability of proposed methodologies, tools, and frameworks.
- **Experience:** Demonstrated expertise in relevant sectors, including industrial hemp, economic analysis, and public-private partnerships.
- **Inclusivity:** Approaches to integrating traditional and smallholder farmers into value chains.

5. SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

To streamline the evaluation process, respondents are requested to adhere to the following guidelines:

- **Format:** Submissions should be structured in sections aligned with the categories listed above (Methodology and Scope, Inclusion and Impact, etc.).
- **Length:** Maximum of 10 - 15 pages, including executive summary, tables, and references. A separate pack of basic information and credentials may also be submitted.
- **Submission Deadline:** 28 February 2025.
- **Delivery Method:** Submissions must be emailed to info@lsf-sa.co.za with the subject line "RFI Response: Hemp Industrialisation Study."

6. RFI DELIVERABLES

Respondents are expected to provide:

- Insights and recommendations based on the outlined questions.
- Case studies or references to similar projects that illustrate best practices.
- High-level budgets or cost estimates for executing the proposed study methodology.
- Any additional information or suggestions relevant to structuring the study.

7. EVALUATION OF RESPONSES

Responses to this RFI may be used to shortlist respondents for the Hemp Industrialisation Study. The LSF reserves the right to use the information obtained to structure the subsequent procurement process.

SECTION 2: TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF REQUEST FOR INFORMATION (RFI)

1. No services must be rendered, or goods delivered in relation to this RFI.
2. Late and/ or incomplete submissions (i.e., submissions which do not include relevant information for evaluation) will not be accepted.
3. Completion and signing of this RFI template and input sheet(s).
4. **Tax clearance requirements:**
It is the responsibility of the participant to ensure that they are registered for Tax and the Tax clearance certificate is submitted.
5. **B-BBEE Requirements:**
South African participants are required to submit a B-BBEE verification certificate indicating the contribution level of the bidding entity. For Exempted Micro Enterprises (EME) with an annual revenue of less than R10 million and Qualifying Small Enterprises (QSE) with an annual revenue of between R10 million and R50 million per annum, a sworn affidavit confirming the annual total revenue and level of black ownership may be submitted. Any misrepresentation in terms of the declaration constitutes a criminal offence as set out in the B-BBEE Act as amended.
Note: If a participant is a Consortium, Joint Venture or Primary Contractor with Subcontractor(s), the documents listed above must be submitted for each Consortium/ JV member or Primary Contractor and Subcontractor(s).
6. **Reasons for disqualification**
LSF reserves the right to disqualify any participant which does any one or more of the following:

 - c) Participant who submitted information that is fraudulent, factually untrue or inaccurate, for example memberships that do not exist, BEE credentials, experience, etc.
 - d) Participant who received information not available to other vendors through fraudulent means.
 - e) Participant who does not comply with any *other requirements* as stipulated in this RFI document.

Protecting personal information is important to the Localisation Support Fund (LSF). To do so, LSF follows general principles in accordance with applicable privacy laws and the Protection of Personal Information Act 4 of 2013 (POPIA (Protection of Personal Information Act)).

LSF's role as a responsible party, is amongst others to process personal information for the intended purpose for which it was obtained and in line with legal agreements with its respective/ prospective clients, third parties, suppliers, and operators.

Who is an Operator? A person or body/ entity which processes personal information for the LSF in terms of a contract or mandate.

Who is a Supplier? A natural or juristic person that provides a product or renders a service to the LSF. A supplier could also be considered as an operator, an independent responsible party or (together with LSF) a joint responsible party.

If the supplier or business partner provides LSF with its related persons' personal information, the supplier or business partner warrants that the related persons are aware of and have consented to the sharing and processing of their personal information with/by LSF.
